2 Tim. 3:16-17; 2 Pet. 1:3; 1 Jn. 5:13

2 Tim. 2:15; 1 Pet. 2:1-2; 2 Pet. 3:18

What happens if we do not grow?

Hosea 4:6-12; Heb. 2:1-3; 5:12-14

Is having a zeal for God enough?

Rom. 10:1-3

Is doing things in the name of God enough?

Mt. 7:21-23

Notice the condition of the people during Isaiah's time:

Isa. 1:1-8

Without learning, we will be no different than the Gentiles during the first century:

Eph. 4:17-19

As Christians, let us not be found ignorant of God's Word because as we have already seen ignorance leads to sin, which will separate us from God. A common saying is that knowledge is power, well there is no other knowledge more powerful than what can be found in God's Word:

Rom. 1:16; Heb. 4:12

Not only does the Word of God teach us about salvation and how to get to heaven, it teaches us how to teach others and to respond to questions or accusations.

1 Pet. 3:15; Col. 4:6; Jam. 1:19

When we make God's Word part of our daily life it will also cause us to be encouraged and give us the confidence to push on:

1 Cor. 15:58

These words came from a man who went through a lot for the cause of Christ **2 Cor. 11:23-28**. Yet he kept his confidence in God **2 Tim. 4:7-8**. So can we.

When we study God's Word, we also learn how we should behave ourselves whether we are assembled with the saints or out in the world.

2 Tim. 3:15

Of course, this is not referring to the structure we meet in, but it talking about us because we are the house of God. Since we represent Christ, we must also conduct ourselves in a Christ-like manner while in the world.

1 Tim. 4:12

Those who were good examples in the first century were commended for the their behavior.

Phil. 2:19-23, 25-30; 2 Cor. 9:1-2

Whether we are around our brethren, friends, coworkers, or enemies we must learn to live our lives based on what God Word says.
